Law, Public Safety, and Security Pathway (LPSS): This pathway is for students interested in the broad career areas of law, public safety, and security. This pathway is open to junior and seniors who are interested in police work, fire fighting, law, EMT, paralegal, officers of the court, FBI, criminal justice, homeland security, etc.

Future Educator Academy (FEA): This academy is for students who have an interest in learning more about a career in education. The course sequence will lead to post-secondary admission in a teacher preparation program. Students will also have the opportunity to be a member of the Future Educators of America, a division of the Phi Delta Kappa network.

Academy of Finance Pathway (AOF): This pathway is part of a nationally acclaimed, industry-validated curriculum model sponsored by the National Academy Foundation. The pathway focuses on preparing students for careers in financial services including accountant, financial analyst, real estate broker, securities broker, bank teller, auditor, insurance adjuster, financial planner, etc. Students who qualify may participate in paid internships between their junior and senior year of high school.

Running Start Program (RS): Pelham High School participates in the NH Project Running Start, a unique higher education initiative for high school students. The program allows current students to enroll in selected New Hampshire Community Technical College courses while completing their high school program. PHS teachers who have a Masters Degree in that discipline and who meet or exceed the hiring qualifications for NHCTC faculty teach Running Start classes at the high school during the day. Students receive an official college transcript and credits that may be used towards completion of a degree, diploma, or certificate. These credits may be transferred to other colleges or universities throughout the country.
