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Pelham Police Explorers

What are the Pelham Police Explorers?

The Pelham Police Explorer Program is open to all youth from the community ranging from 14 to 21 years in age. The Police Exploring Program is sanctioned by the Boy Scouts of America, and is maintained and staffed by members of the Pelham Police Department. The Exploring Program is a structured program that gives young men and women the academic and technical training needed to become future Law Enforcement Officers. The program also gives Explorers the leadership skills and selfdiscipline needed to become successful community leaders.

How do I join the Pelham Police Explorers?

To become a Police Explorer, applicants must attend an Explorer Academy, which teaches the basic skills utilized by Explorers throughout their Explorer experience. The Explorer Program focuses on team building skills and unity, while teaching these young men and women to work together for one common goal.

To become a Police Explorer, one must complete an Explorer Application and return the application to the Police Department. Police Explorer Cadets will be introduced into the Explorer Program and attend monthly meetings.

What are the honor cord requirements for the Law, Public Safety and Security Pathway?

An honor cord signifying your academic achievement in the Law, Public Safety and Security Pathway will be awarded to students who complete the following requirements:

- Completion of required and elective courses in the Law, Public Safety and Security Pathway with an overall 3.0 GPA
- Minimum overall 2.5 GPA in all high school courses
- Participation in the Police Explorer Program with the Pelham Police Department or other approved extended learning opportunity
