

School and Community

Pelham High School is a four-year, comprehensive public high school accredited by the New Hampshire Department of Education and the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. Pelham is a suburban town located in the southernmost point of New Hampshire with a population of approximately 13,000 people. Students are encouraged to take courses from a variety of subject areas to fulfill their 26 credit graduation requirement.

Curriculum

Pelham High School provides its students with a comprehensive curriculum. Progressive work is available in the core subject areas. A course without a leveling designation is designed for the college and career bound student. All level 1 courses provide an accelerated program for college-bound students. Students who elect Honors earn the notation on their transcripts.

We offer a challenging and individualized academic experience for our students. In addition to offering Honors, AP level courses and college credit opportunities, Pelham provides students with opportunities to extend their learning through independent study, internships, and online learning through the Virtual Learning Academy and Edgenuity.

Competency-Based Education

Students advance through a course or earn credit based on their ability to master skills or competencies in a content area. Each course includes three competencies students are expected to master (1) Skills and Content Knowledge; (2) Application and Analysis; and (3) Communication. Each competency is broken down into a smaller set of required skills, abilities, and knowledge.

Class Schedule

Pelham high school has an alternating block schedule with full year and semester classes. Students take four classes per day for 80 minutes plus a 45minute advisory for social and emotional learning and academic support. Note: Due to COVID, the 2020-2021 academic year is temporarily operating on a 4 x 4 block schedule in which students take four 75-minute classes every day and finish a 1 credit course in one semester rather a full school year.

Note: From March 2020 until June 2020 students were all remote. During the 2020-2021 academic year, students have the option of being completely remote or in school during Semester 1. There is no indication of this on the transcript.

Grading

Pelham uses a rolling grade system and the calculation for all final course grades are based on a student mastery of course specific competencies. GPA is reported on the transcript as weighted. GPA does not include "Pass/Fail" courses or courses transferred to Pelham High School.

Note: Pelham High adopted the following parameters for 2019-2020 in response to COVID: Letter/numerical grades were calculated and all work was expected to be completed and grades were issued.

Career and Technical Programs
